AMBS statistics

- In 2018–19, AMBS's graduate student body included 71 U.S. students, six Canadian students and 21 international students.
- The 2019 graduating class comprised 13 men and seven women from nine countries on five continents — including **Suzanne Engle Ford** (Fort Collins). Nine of the graduates completed at least part of their seminary studies at a distance.
- In 2018–19, 11 men and six women from five states and one province were enrolled in the nondegree Journey program.
