Recent articles by credentialed ministers in our conference

Pastor Erica Lea-Simka writes in <u>this article</u>: "To be human is to experience a wide variety of abilities and disabilities among our species. As an antidote to oppressive "I and It" relationships, Wilmer invites us to reclaim a "humble use of power" in "I and Thou" relationships with our Creator and one another—relationships that treat others as God's image-bearers and work for equal justice.

Mike Martin writes in <u>this article</u> the heartbreaking reality that "Gun violence is now the leading cause of death for children in the U.S., surpassing car accidents in 2020" and that "transforming guns into garden tools over the past nine years has completely transformed me."





COVID-19 Considerations

Denver is currently in the high category for Covid. "Under a high COVID-19 community level, the CDC recommends people wear masks indoors and on public transit (preferably a high-quality mask like a KN95 or N95), stay up-to-date with their COVID-19 vaccinations, and get tested if they start experiencing cold-like symptoms." We highly recommend everyone plan to wear masks indoors. We will have hand sanitizer and N95 masks available and use hygienic practices with food. We will continue to monitor the COVID-19 level and CDC recommendations. Adjustments will be made for high risk activities (i.e. eating, hymn sing, etc.) as needed, which may include moving activities outdoors as much as possible. Stay tuned as we get closer to the event for any further Covid updates.
