-Erin Kauffman, a farmer and rancher in Alamosa, led an 8-week book study on food and faith as part of her conference-funded Future Anabaptist Leaders internship. She says: "Through the Faith and Food Book Club, I learned about the ways that many people in Mountain States Mennonite Conference are living their faith through their choices around food, in growing, purchasing, cooking, teaching, and sharing. While we encountered increasing complexity around the questions of how to be faithful with our food, we were encouraged and inspired to find so many others in our faith community also on this journey!"

--Conference leaders provide resourcing and updates to churches through in-person and written communications including guest preaching, the *Zing!* newsletter, social media, weekly emails, and many conversations to share and learn from each other.

—**Ministerial Council** is working on the pastoral ethics covenant, healthy boundaries for pastors, and credentialing chaplains and pastors.

—The pastors in our conference have opportunities to gather regularly, including the Southern pastors group (SECOMP), Northern pastors group (DAAM), and the All Pastors meeting. --Coming up: Assembly is July 21-23, 2023 at Rocky Mountain Mennonite Camp on the theme *Spirit of Power* with guest speaker Isaac Villegas.

As far as our conference-supported **Passion Ministries**:

—**RAWtools turns 10 this year!** In 2022, The peace-building nonprofit facilitated 10 buybacks involving survivors and community members to help disable over 1,000 firearms in Colorado.

BY THE NUMBERS:

Since Assembly in July of 2022...

Conference leaders have represented Mountain States at 8 national meetings (both in-person and Zoom).

Our Conference Moderator has volunteered approximately 250 hours of his time and expertise to ensure the conference is running smoothly.

And our Conference Minister:

Met with conference pastors and leaders in 159 one-on-one meetings.

Is supporting 7 churches in major transitions (pastoral, building, etc.), and has supported multiple other churches during conflicts or crises.

Is part of 2 teams working on nationwide projects: a study of women in ministry and revamping MC USA's misconduct policy.

Assembled two new task forces to dream about the future of Mountain States and make things happen, including a social enterprise task force, and a new faith communities (a.k.a. church planting) task force.
